Why is a municipal by-election being held?

A by-election is held when one or more seats on the municipal council need to be filled.



The by-election will be held on June 4 2023 .

You will be able to vote for one of the candidates running for each available seat.

The role of your returning officer

The returning officer is responsible for organizing the election in your municipality.

Élections Québec helps the returning officer carry out his or her duties.

Voting in a municipal by-election

You need to:

- Be entered on the list of electors
- Be at least 18 years of age on election day
- Be a Canadian citizen*
- Live in the municipality*
- Have been domiciled in Québec for at least six months*

Also, you must not have lost your election rights.*

If you do not live in the municipality,
you need to have owned a building
or occupied a business establishment
in the municipality for at least one year.*

* As of the date of reference.

Is your name entered on the list of electors?

Live in the municipality?

You should make sure your name is entered on the list of electors at your current address.

Three ways to check!

- Online, at www.electionsquebec.qc.ca/check/municipal
- On the **information notice** you received (or will soon receive) in the mail
- By contacting your returning officer

The **information notice** contains:

- The name of each person entered on the list of electors who reside at your address
- The address where you should visit if your name is not on the notice or if it is misspelled

If you want to vote, your name MUST be entered on the list of electors.

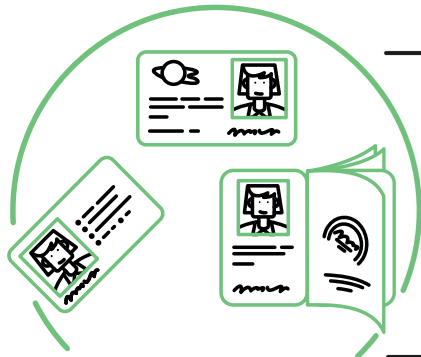
If you want to correct the above information by submitting an application for entry, striking or correction, or if you want to consult the list of electors, you must appear before the board of returning officers at the following address, days and times.

Address: 000, street name A1A 1A1
Schedule: On Date, from 00:00 to 00:00
On Date, from 00:00 to 00:00

If you are making an application for entry, you must present two documents. One must show the name and date of birth of the person who will be voting and the other must show his or her name and domiciliary address.

A person who owns or occupies a business establishment must contact the returning officer to complete an application for a power of attorney. Occupant co-owners must file a power of attorney with the returning officer.

Exceptional circumstances related to the health situation
person seeking a change to the list of electors



Bring two pieces of identification.

Together, they must show your name, date of birth and address.

If you have not received your information notice:

- Contact your municipality's returning officer

If you have any questions, please contact your returning officer by calling (450) 247 2050.

Do you want to vote before the day of the by-election?

Refer to your information notice

or

look for public announcements from your municipality on when and where to vote at an advance poll.

All locations where you can vote before election day are accessible to mobility impaired persons.

You will find the address of your polling station:

- On your information notice
- In various public announcements released by your municipality during the election period

You may also be able to vote by mail, under certain conditions.

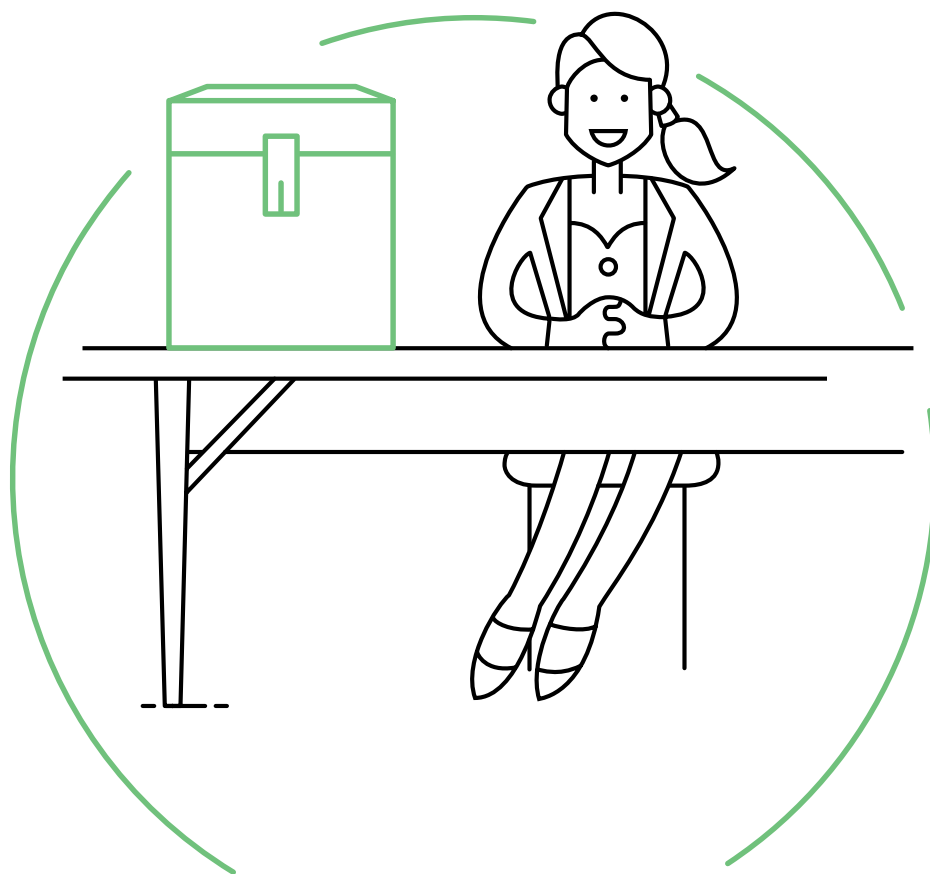

How do I vote?

Visit the address
listed on the notice
you received in the mail.

A person will greet you.
Tell the person your name.
The person will then point you
in the right direction.

What to bring when you go to vote

Bring one
of these identification documents:



- Your Québec driver's licence



- Your Québec health insurance card



- Your Canadian passport



- Your Certificate of Indian Status



- Your Canadian Forces identification card

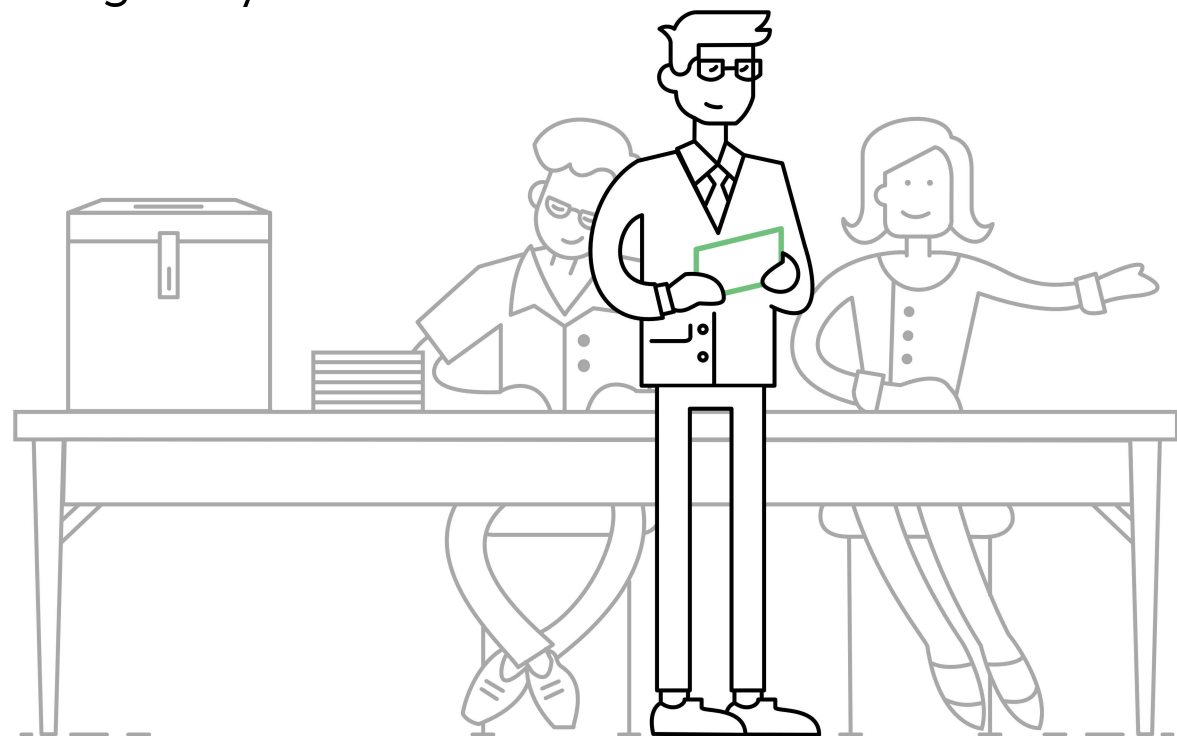
If you have any questions, please contact your returning officer

At the table,
say your name and address,
and show a piece of identification.

You will be given ballot papers
and a pencil.

You need to vote using the pencil
that the election officer gives you.

Go behind
the cardboard
polling booth.

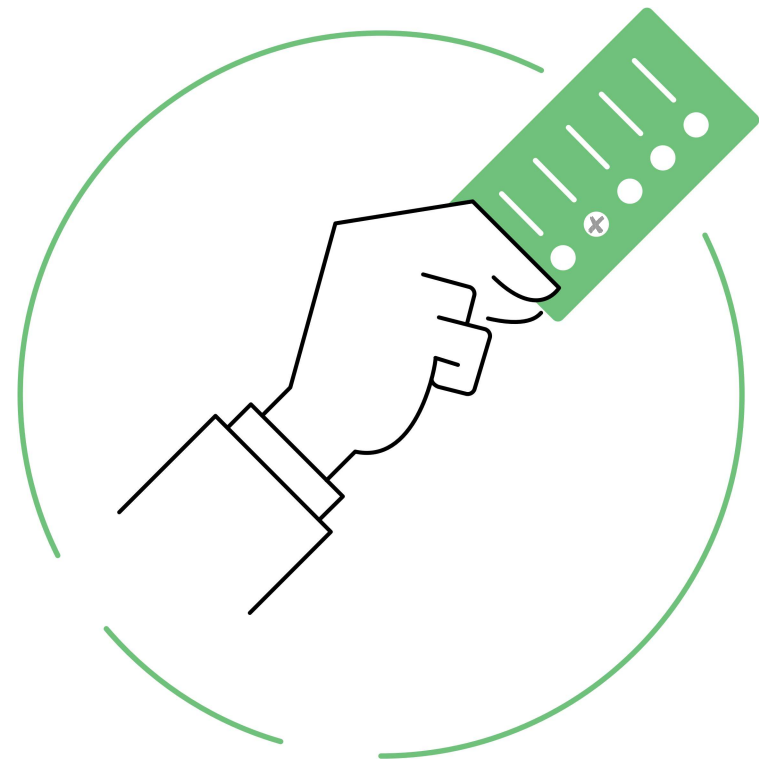
On each ballot paper,
put an X, a check mark or any mark
in the circle next to the name
of the person you want to vote for.



Select **only one** name
on each ballot paper.

Don't worry if your mark extends
a little beyond the circle.

Just make sure it doesn't touch
any of the other circles.

Fold the ballot paper
and go back to the person
at the table.

The person will tell you
how to insert your ballot paper
into the box on the table.

Polling place accessibility

On election day,
nearly all voting locations
are accessible
to mobility impaired persons.

You can check
if your voting location is accessible
by calling the number listed
at the **bottom of this page**.



**If your voting location is not accessible,
ask where you can vote.**

after 8 p.m. on June 4, 2023 .



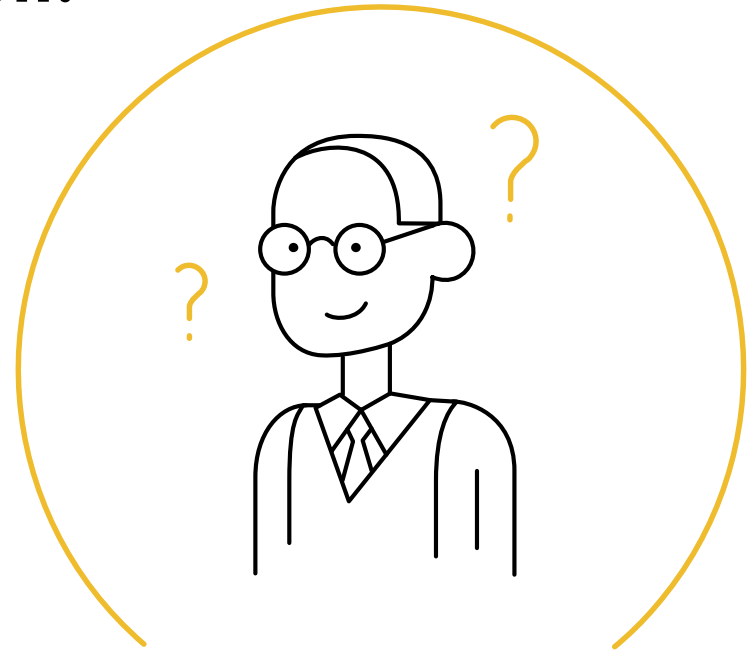
